

HOLY LISTENING

I've been doing a lot of listening lately. I've heard stories and tales from all ages of what's going on in their lives, what they like or don't like about the church these days.

I've been listening and talking with my mother as she adjusts to widowhood. Every once in a while she will say, "I miss him." And I know in some sense what she means. I miss my step dad as well. Even those silly card games I dreaded. I miss them.

Sometimes I listen to my young grandchildren chatter on the phone about their days at pre-school or first grade. That kind of listening takes a special attentive ear to sort out their words and excitement.

I've been listening to you who are worried about illnesses and dying. I've been listening to your hopes and dreams for your church. I've heard stories about your families, your work, and your faith journeys. Quaker writer Douglas Steere calls this Holy Listening. He says, "Holy Listening – to listen another's soul into life, into a condition of disclosure and discovery, may be almost the greatest service that any human being ever performs for another. This kind of listening is life-giving."

Especially during a time of transition it is important for us to be holy listeners. Think how much better you feel when you have shared a concern, a prayer request, a moment of joy with your holy listener. You listen to us as well – the staff, the ministers, the lay leaders. And we continue building this community of faith to listen to one another, to affirm each other, to be honest and direct, and to offer and then receive forgiveness. That's all part of building up the community of faith. But when we each take time daily to do some "holy listening" I think we are preparing to receive a blessing and to bring us together even more. A portion of one of my favorite poems says it best:

When someone deeply listens to you It is like holding out a dented cup You've had since childhood And watching it fill up with Cold, fresh water. When it balances on top of the brim, You are understood. When it overflows and touches your skin, You are loved.

When someone deeply listens to you, The room where you stay Starts a new life And the place where you wrote Your first poem Begins to glow in your mind's eye. It is as if gold has been discovered!

When someone deeply listens to you, Your bare feet are on the earth And a beloved land that seemed distant Is now at home within you.
