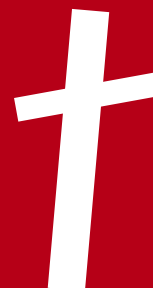

With adjustments to the design and the bid from Altounian, we are now within our budget. The Construction Committee approved a motion to move forward with Altounian as the construction company. SUMMARY: We had a very strong December and ended 2017 with a \$25,858 operating deficit against a budgeted deficit of \$154,999. The positive results reflect outstanding pledge fulfillment, strong investment income, tight control of operating expenses, and no major unforeseen expenses.





February 11 is the 19th Annual Cookie Day

For 19 years our church has been baking, buying, and bringing cookies for the Night Ministry to our church kitchen. Then PYF packages them (3 per package), and delivers them to Night Ministry office. Then they are given to the Night Ministry bus to give to the cold, hungry folks who have come to the bus for warmth, counseling, and health care. For some, this may be their only meal for the whole day.


Please no NUTS or PEANUT BUTTER

This special bus is on the streets 6 nights a week at specific locations in Chicago offering assistance to street people. In addition to the bus, the Night Ministry also has a team of brave folks who go into the underpasses, bridges, etc. where there are known homeless enclaves. These teams bring sandwiches and medical care with them. The N.M. also provides housing, health care, outreach spiritual care and social services to teenagers and young adults in Chicago who struggle with homelessness, poverty, and loneliness. GCC has helped support this agency for many years.

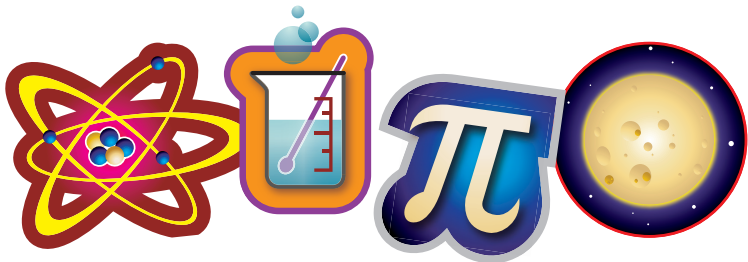
