

DOORWAYS

I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than live in the tents of wickedness.

--Psalm 84:10b

I'm writing this article on Tuesday, January 27th...the 70th anniversary of the liberation of 7,000 sick and dying prisoners from the Auschwitz Concentration Camp by the Soviet army. A facility that was originally built in Nazi-annexed Poland to house Polish political prisoners, Auschwitz became perhaps the most infamous extermination factory of the Holocaust.

Perhaps the most memorable image of Auschwitz is the entrance gate whose wrought iron proclaims: Arbeit Macht Frei, or work makes us free. In reality, this gate welcomed its visitors to slavery, not freedom... to death, not life.

Doorways either welcome or turn away. They either include or exclude. They invite us into new opportunities and possibilities, or they turn us away from places where we do not belong.

My great hope and fervent prayer is that the doorways at Glenview Community Church are always the former: doorways that invite, include and welcome. In the words of St. John in his Revelation:

Look, I have set before you an open door, which no one is able to shut. I know that you have but little power, and yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name.

--Revelation 3:8b

In response to that verse, we have new doors on the West Entrance doorway at GCC! When the West Entrance was built, one of its primary purposes was to make our church building more accessible through the addition of a commercial elevaJanuary 28, 2015

tor. This elevator makes it possible to reach the chapel, sanctuary and lower level for those for whom steps are a barrier. However, the original West Entrance doors could not be operated by those with access challenges. Those doors were equipped with handles that had to be turned and pulled; something difficult to impossible for many. Now, those doors have been replaced and equipped with a power opener. With one touch, square silver buttons inside and out open the door automatically! What a wonderful addition, and what a wonderful way to say with our building: no matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you're welcome here!

While you are being ably led in worship by Elizabeth Hartung-Ciccolini and Pam Keckler on Sunday, February 8, Jeanie and I will be worshipping in Green Bay at Union UCC as that congregation dedicates a new stained glass window in commemoration of our eighteen years there and my service as Senior Minister. That window resides in the transom light above the doorway to the education wing of that church building: a doorway that welcomes God's children to the new opportunities and possibilities of a vibrant and growing faith. Here's the window:



Finally, a new doorway opens for us on February 18. That's the date of Ash Wednesday this year, and the doorway that it opens for us is the doorway into the hope and promise of God's amazing love that transforms us when we set ourselves free from the shackles of our past through repentance and embrace the salvation of our future in

Our goal is to complete 300 bags of soup mix for the San Lucas Food Pantry.

I wanted to thank everybody for helping me take advantage of the incredible opportunity Chuck provided in challenging me to do something with my "talents." I have made a fabulous new friend, seen incredible generosity, and have been reminded of the terrific feeling that results from helping others. My 100 talents were



doubled by a generous donor. With half of my talents, I was able to plant 100 trees to help preserve wildlife and combat climate change. With the other half, I purchased 100 tubes of M&Ms through Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) to share with you. Each person that took a tube was asked to enjoy the candy, fill the tube with quarters, and return it to me to take back to FMSC. At 22 cents per meal, a full tube of quarters provides 63



meals to malnourished children. My \$100 as a cash donation would have provided 455 meals. Instead, you have helped provide 3,836 meals! And many of you are still filling your tubes!!! We had a return rate of 50% and FMSC generally only sees 10-20% of tubes come back. Keep them coming—I will continue to take tubes of quarters to FMSC as long as people want to fill them. For every tube I turn in, I get a new tube of candy in return, so if you missed out before and want to participate, there is a box of new tubes in the office to the right of the couch.
