A LOVE STORY

That phrase is taken from a hymn text that was written by Purd E. Dietz in 1936 for Jean Sibelius' tune **Finlandia**. This hymn belongs particularly to the tradition of our United Church of Christ, though it has limited use in the hymnody of other traditions. Here's the full text of the original first verse:

***We would be building;
temples still undone
o'er crumbling walls their
crosses scarcely lift
waiting 'till love can raise
the broken stone,
and hearts creative bridge
the human rift;
we would be building;
Master, let Thy plan
reveal the life that God
would give to man.***

Rev. Dietz was ordained by the Reformed Church in the United States and became a seminary professor: first at Central Theological Seminary in Cleveland, Ohio and then at Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri after Central merged with Eden and moved to St. Louis in 1934.

Though Professor Dietz used the imagery of erecting a physical edifice...perhaps even the great cathedrals of Europe that took hundreds of years to complete...that imagery is a metaphor for the building of the church that is the body of Christ, the community of believers that embodies and extends the love of God that we know in Jesus.

Nevertheless, I've been hearing the words of this great hymn in my head lately because of our conversation about the capital needs of the Glenview Community Church and the likely potential of a capital campaign to address those needs. This church

building as we know it built in four stages over thirteen years, struggling to keep pace with the phenomenal growth of this congregation in the 1940s and 1950s:

**The sanctuary in 1946,
The education wing and gym in 1950,
The office wing in 1955, and
The chancel and transept in 1959.**

Since 1959 an elevator was added to the narthex (no longer working), the west entrance was expanded and an elevator was installed, the Buzard organ was installed, major improvements were made to the sanctuary and beyond with the **Creating Sacred Space** project and, in the last year, we have installed a new audio and video capture system with digital signage, renewed the Chapel, and we have rebuilt the parking lots.

Very soon you will be receiving a letter inviting you to participate in congregational conversations about our building. Because of a Useful Life Study recently completed by an engineering firm, we are well-versed in the systems maintenance and replacement needs of our facility. More importantly, we need your input on how our building needs to be renovated and equipped to support our ministry into the next decades.

Church buildings can become shrines, especially when church buildings are as substantial and architecturally pleasing as is ours. However, the building really is no more than a home for the congregation and a tool for carrying out our ministry in Glenview. It is a resource, and needs to be as dynamic and as responsive to the needs of God's people as do we. Purd Dietz's hymn challenges us to make both our congregation and its building a living, striving, changing, yet to

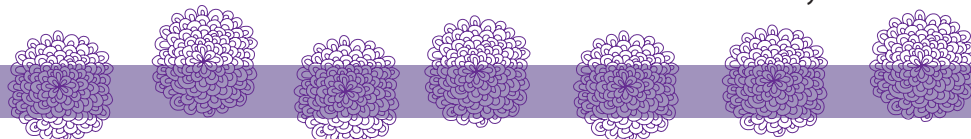

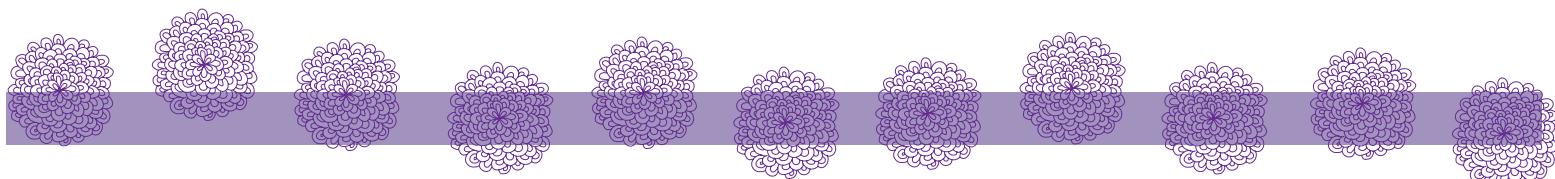

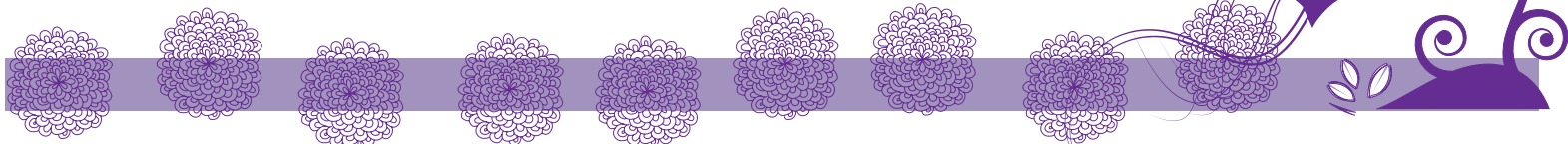
