# **TRUE TO JESUS**

He is a pastoral colleague; a Roman Catholic priest who served two parishes in the Green Bay diocese during my 18 years at Union UCC there. We were acquaintances who respected each other's ministries. Even from a distance I knew that his ministry was genuine, compassionate, courageous, faithful, and humble. A little over a year ago he was appointed to a new parish; one of the most prominent in the diocese. Last week, a friend forwarded a letter that he had written to his parish. Here's a portion of that letter:

After an unsettled, overwhelming year... it has become clear to me, through the routine and extraordinary events of the parish life, that I do not have the capacity and the skills to lead this 'parish family' forward at this crucial time. I mean that simply as an honest truth: I am not the 'right fit'... This does not disparage the parish, or me. No 'blame' intended; it's just the reality of things. So, at my request, after much prayer, soul-searching, sleeplessness and consultation, the bishop has given me permission to conclude my assignment here on Friday, March 1st.

I was surprised, even stunned. But then I was filled with admiration for his integrity, and with inspiration for how remarkably he had 'spoken the truth in love.' Here are his concluding words:

The challenges and opportunities of my ministry in this parish have brought me closer to Jesus, more fervent, faithful, even desperate, in prayer...and finding Him always close by. For that, I am most grateful.

As difficult and unsettled as his fourteen months of ministry in that parish were, he still felt the Spirit of God at work in him, bringing him closer to Jesus.

Next Wednesday – March 6th – is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. The purpose, promise and power of Lent is to bring us closer to Jesus. Sometimes that happens when we are overwhelmed with the glories and goodness of life. Yet if we only come closer to Jesus in these magnificent experiences, our faith may not be up to the hard realities of life. Thank God our faith is not just for fair weather! Thank God that, even when life is filled with challenges, and difficulties, and heartache, we can come closer to Jesus, just as my pastoral colleague has. As the 23rd Psalm confesses: Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me...

The theme of Lent at GCC this year is **True to Jesus**. Join us as we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday. Join one of the pastors in the sanctuary from 7:00 to 8:00 a.m. for spiritual conversation and the imposition of ashes. At 7:30 p.m. we will gather in the sanctuary for Ash Wednesday worship in the style of Taizé with the imposition of ashes and holy communion.

Then, through the Sundays of Lent, we will unfold our theme as we go deeper into the facets of what being true to Jesus means as we live our lives:

My prayer is that, through this theme on Sundays and in many other ways, devoting ourselves to being true to Jesus will bring us closer to Jesus in mind and heart, in word and deed, in love and life. Let's come closer to Jesus, together. See you in church!

## ation GIVING GLIMPSE DECEMBER 2018

Our transition from 2018 to 2019 included saying good bye to our retiring Business Administrator Dale Wittenberg and welcoming Lucinda Fuller as our new Business Administrator. The final results of fiscal year 2018 are extremely favorable, but only through the grace of God: helped along by forward thinking church decisions, Wall Street's bear market, and very generous GCC members and friends. The congregation approved a 2018 operating deficit of \$79,779. We closed the year with an operating SURPLUS of \$8,335. This was achieved despite a pledge fulfillment \$43K below budget. High level details are outlined below and were explained in detail at the Sunday, February 24 Mid-Winter Congregational meeting.

**SUMMARY:** We finished 2018 in such a strong position because of remarkable investment income, generous non-pledge contributions, and properties expenses that were \$40K below budget because we experienced no major failures. These favorable elements allowed us to achieve an operating surplus over budget.

For 2019, we need pledges to achieve our goal of \$970,000 and pledge fulfillment to return to expected levels. 2019 is already burdened by three essential, major and costly facility repairs/replacements. We also cannot be assured that non-pledge giving and investment income will remain favorable.

# 2019 GENEROSITY CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Thank you to all who have continued to generously support Glenview Community Church. As of February 1, we have received pledges for \$868,324 from 293 pledgers.

There is always more work to do, more volunteers needed, more money to ask for...

The level of pledges needed to support 2019 salaries, maintenance, programs, and mission is \$970,000. Expenses cannot be reduced any further and we need increased pledge revenue to make up the funding gap. Our faith community is caring and generous. We are asking members and friends of GCC to prayerfully consider pledg-ing to support the annual operating needs of minister and staff salaries, maintenance, programs, and missions.
