

GLENVIEW COMMUNITY CHURCH MEMORIAL GARDEN AND COMMITTEE

The idea for a memorial garden was born in the mind of Rev. Dr. Robert Alward (1973-1989), who suggested the space presently used for the garden be precisely for this purpose. I have in my files a letter I sent to him in 1973 applauding his idea, though I said that my husband and I didn't expect to use it soon (my husband is using it now as of 2001). Clearly I was not the only one who thought this was a good idea, since the Memorial Garden was created in 1989 and the credit for the funds and the work for creating it goes to Chapter 2, whose small commemorative plaque stands in an area of the Garden.

In 2004, the Memorial Garden received renewed attention through the generosity of two anonymous donors and another letter to my files from Rev. Dr. Howard Roberts on April 29, 2004, comments on the beauty and serenity of the restored and enhanced Garden. A noted landscape architect, Marvin Wehler, trained by the early famous Chicago gardener/landscape architect, Jens Jensen, designed the present Garden around the beautiful Redbud tree which was part of the original Garden and an irrigation system was added to the plan to help in maintaining the Garden during the spring, summer and fall months of the year.

The care for the Garden and the plants in the church hallway, from which you view the Memorial Garden, are the responsibility of the Memorial Garden Committee, whose members are Cindy Gabuzzi, Bud Hermann, Dori Hirsch, Shannon Hogan, Sue Hunt, Micky Johnson, Margy and Don Iverson, Irene Kreer, Barbara Marsh and Joyce Zylke. The Committee meets for an hour or two on Wednesdays, one in early April, the second in early October. Each member of the Committee takes care of the Garden and the plants in the hallway four weeks of the year

(not consecutively! - two weeks at a time). Note: if you like to tend plants and flowers and get rid of the occasional weed, come join us. We would welcome more members (please call Irene Kreer 847-724-7784).

The Glenview Community Church office has a brochure which describes the process for using the garden as part of church members' funeral arrangements. Because cremains are interred not only under the paving stones of the Garden but also maybe scattered among the plants and flowers, its use is unlimited.

A beautiful book, updated regularly, one of the duties of the Memorial Garden Committee, is in the case which stands in the hallway overlooking the garden. It lists deceased church members. Please open the case and look through all of the pages.

Three years ago we thought the Garden had "arrived" because a robin built a nest in the branches of a juniper tree. We were very excited and took a picture of the nest which appeared in the Broadcaster. Unfortunately for us and the robin, it was not a good place to build a nest and that has not happened again (birds are smart creatures). All three of the new hatchlings were not able to understand how to fly up and out of the enclosure of the Garden's walls. So now we enjoy the Garden and are happy there are no nests in the trees.



FRIDAY, APRIL 27 *Henry David Thoreau - America's Conscience presented by* Jerrol Leitner

Thoreau's contemporaries found him prickly, ill-mannered and homely. Ralph Waldo Emerson, his friend and mentor, thought Harvard-trained Thoreau had frittered away his talent, leading readers "on a huckleberry party." However, in the 150 years since his death, Thoreau has become the patron saint of ecologists, conscientious objectors, non-violent protesters, advocates of simple living, champions of self-discovery, and proponents of limited government. This session looks at Thoreau the man and his increasingly relevant contributions to American thought. Can anyone resist a man who, when asked if he had made his peace with God, replied, "I didn't know we quarreled."

FRIDAY, MAY 25
"Why Ayn Rand Ignites the right"
Presented by Jim Kenney

"It as the morality of altruism that undercut America and is now destroying her." These are the words of Ayn Rand, drawn from "For the New Intellectual", dedicated to the exaltation of selfishness and to the body of thought she called objectivism". But how did this strange (and enthusiastically godless) Russian emigre become the patron intellectual of so many on America's far right? Perhaps the answer lies in another of her dicta: "Capitalism and altruism are incompatible; they are philosophical opposites; they cannot co-exist in the same man or in the same society." In this session, we'll sketch the life of Rand, lay out the essential structure of objectivist thought, and discuss her magnum opus, the novel "Atlas Shrugged" why has that turgid work begun to fly off bookstore shelves, after a long dormancy?





FRIDAY, JUNE 22
Water and the World Reimagining Our Future
presented by Nancy Tuchman and
Jim Kenney

The most serious resource crisis facing Earth and its people does not center on oil and other energy resources. It is, rather, the fresh water crisis. Water - the elixir of life has shaped every human society. In this lecture, Nancy and Jim will explore the three ages of water. The first was defined by water's scarcity. The second, launched the Industrial Revolution, made water a commodity, available in even the driest landscapes. The third age, just beginning, is our own. Population pressures and lifestyles are draining aquifers. We'll take a careful scientific and cultural look at the implications and some possible scenarios.
