

#### **EASTERTIDE**

Back in the late 1960s, the songs of Donald Avery and Richard Marsh caught fire in the mainline church. They wrote simple words and set them to tunes that were spirited and upbeat. Their signature song begins this way:

## I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together!

It's simple and its true...and we embody its truth in the Glenview Community Church whose foundation and core is the community of believers. In the words of the Apostle Paul to the Corinthian Christians: We are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

But just now I have another of Avery and Marsh's songs stuck in my head. Here's the refrain:

Every morning is Easter morning, from now on! Every day's resurrection day, the past is over and gone!

Every morning is Easter morning! Christians worship on Sunday, the first day of the week, because it is the day of Jesus' resurrection. So it makes some sense for us to say that every Sunday is Easter Sunday. We sometimes forget that in Lent. Some clergy and churches stop saying and singing Alleluia during Lent because it's a penitential season. But doing that gives up the central reality of Sunday for Christians... the reality of the resurrection. For this reason the church has never counted Sundays in the forty days of Lent. These Sundays are in Lent, but they are not of Lent. Yes, every Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection. Every Sunday is Easter Sunday!

But Avery and Marsh go even farther than that. They are singing us into believing

that every *morning* is Easter *morning*: 365 days each year, every year of our lives! No matter what the fickle seasons and circumstances of our lives, every morning is Easter morning. What a gift! What an assurance! What a perspective on life! When we greet someone we meet on the street, or in a store, or in another public place, we probably say *Hello*, or *Hi*, or *Good morning*... *Good afternoon...Good evening*. So, what difference would it make if we replaced these expected greetings with the Easter good news...if we greeted the people we meet with the words: *Christ is risen!* 

This is **Eastertide!** I love that old name for this season. It means *Easter time*, and it reminds us that Easter is a season rather than just a day. On the church calendar it begins with Easter and ends with Pentecost. And in this Eastertide we're celebrating a lot of Easter at the Glenview Community Church! Every Sunday is blessed with something special that emphasizes the resurrection. So we celebrated *Easter* on April 5th in two grand services of joyful worship. We celebrated **Beatles Sunday** on April 12th and discovered the deep meaning of those timeless songs. We celebrated **Open House** Sunday on April 19th and emphasized the physical reality of Jesus' resurrection that calls us to share God's love by giving physical gifts of life to others. Our children led us in energetic worship on April 26th as they presented *The Sailor's Bible*. We will rejoice with 38 eighth graders as they say YES to God on *Confirmation Sunday*, May 3rd. We will celebrate the resurrection as we experience it in human love on Mothers Day Sunday, May 10th. We will celebrate the resurrection through music as our Chancel Choir under the direction of Guest Conductor Josh Chodoroff presents Robert Ray's **Gospel Mass** and we receive new members on Sunday, May 17th. We will celebrate the

## **PONDERING IN SILENCE...**

The Word of Scripture should never stop sounding in your ears and working in you all day long, just like the words of someone you love. And just as you do not analyze the words of someone you love, but accept them as they are said to you, accept the Word of Scripture and ponder it in your heart, as Mary did. That is all.
