

CLAY JARS

In his second letter to the fledgling church at Corinth, the Apostle Paul wrote these beautiful words about how God fills and uses our mortal humanness for divine purpose:

But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. 2 Corinthians 4:7-12

Clay jars: bodies of flesh and bone...persons and personalities that are endowed with strengths and weaknesses, gifts and deficits; fragile human bodies that witness to the enduring realities of faith, hope and love that belong to God alone. This is how God blesses the world and calls it toward its destiny. We humans are the earthen vessels that bear God's holy gifts in the world and for God's people.

As May came to a close we said good bye to two members of the church staff who embodied God's treasures for us. Marilyn Belleau retired after serving as the Advocate Health Parish Nurse at Glenview Community Church for nearly 27 years. When Marilyn began her ministry with Lutheran General at GCC on August 1, 1986, she was one of six pioneers in the Parish Nursing ministry envisioned by the Rev. Granger Westberg. Marilyn has not only carried out this ministry; she has embodied it so thoroughly that it's nearly impossible to separate her personality from the position. I am grateful for those of you who have borne witness to the importance of Marilyn's ministry. I want to assure you that I am committed to the personal pastoral ministry that is precious to this church. Toward that end, I am thrilled that the Rev. Dale Susan Edmonds will be serving as our Interim Coordinator of Congregational Care for the next months as we review the staffing needs of our ministries and plan for the future. Having served as a hospice chaplain Dale is familiar with the health care world. Dale will be serving half-time and is available through the church office. Please call on her with your pastoral and congregational care concerns.

Kathy Lifton, who has served for several years as our Director of Children's Ministry, also left us at the end of this program year. This congregation has no more sacred trust than the faith formation and Christian education of our children. As we seek to fulfill that trust, I am so pleased that Elizabeth Hartung-Ciccolini, our Minister for Youth, will also be serving as our Minister for Children. Elizabeth is a committed member of GCC and shares her incredible gifts for ministry with the 6, 7 and 8 Club and PYF. How blessed we are that Elizabeth has answered the call to become our Minister for Youth and Children!

All of us who serve on the pastoral and ministry staff of the Glenview Community Church are called not to do ministry on your behalf. Instead, we are called to enable each of you to fulfill your ministry, for Jesus' sake. All of us are clay jars. All of us are earthen vessels. Yet in us and through us, God intends to do amazing things! The treasure is in us, and it lives through us. From one clay pot to another, I humbly say: Let's do great things for God...and for God's children...and for God's world! See you in church!
