because that is the only treasure you can give with your heart and it doesn't cost a cent.

Remember, to say "I love you" to your partner and your loved ones, but most of all mean it.

A kiss and an embrace will mend hurt when it comes from deep inside of you.

Remember to hold hands and cherish the moment,

for someday that person will not be there again.

Give time to love, give time to speak, give time to share the precious thoughts in your mind.

Carlin's advice is valuable regardless of what stage of life we are in or what life transitions we are experiencing. Heeding his advice will strengthen our relationships, enrich our lives, and deepen the value and meaning of life for those we "remember" and for ourselves as well.

My Faith - My Church



I have been an active member of a congregational church for my entire life. Some of my best memories were as a child or young adult singing in the choir, attending church camp, asking lots of imper-

tinent questions in our high school youth group or even, until one year ago when my childhood church was destroyed by the epic floods in Cedar Rapids, returning to church while visiting Mom in Iowa.

GCC has been my church home since 1983; my community and my family. I sing in the choir, have taught Sunday School, have been privileged to work with the Adult Education, Music and Missions Boards and am honored to serve as Moderator this year.

Simply put, church has always been an important part of my life and today GCC is that church. I have been asked to write about my "faith journey" and that is much more difficult as my faith journey is all about music and community and much less about faith in the traditional meaning of the word. My faith journey is an ongoing exploration of sacred music and our Christian community. Music, in all its variations, is worship for me and always has been. I am blessed that my journey has brought me to a church community full of music people who share their gifts as a form of worship. It is inspiring to be among such people and my faith has grown because of them.

Being part of the GCC community means much more however. I am passionately committed to both the ideals and the realities of a congregational church like GCC. I want to be part of a community and a tradition that has championed the rights of slaves, enthusiastically welcomed women and minorities as lay leaders and called ministers, fought for justice and peace, and truly welcomed all regardless of background or beliefs. It is probably true that I am unusual in not actively seeking for guidance or spiritual leadership from the called ministers. Rather, I look to individuals in the congregation as examples to help me more fully understand what it means to be a Christian. I have learned much from their quiet grace, thoughtful and spirited discussion, patient listening and inspired mission work. I know that if I am able to "pay attention" as Doug Runnels repeatedly encouraged, I just may be able to be the kind of person I wish to be.


Financial Summary




