In 2004 with the leadership of the Planning Committee, we embarked on an involved strategic, long range planning process. Cathy Ach served as our facilitator. A wide variety of members participated in the process that culminated in the adoption by the congregation in 2005 of a vision statement: a strong community of Christian faith that welcomes and engages all people in personal and spiritual growth and a mission statement: learning, loving, and serving in God's name. Four goals were adopted to focus our efforts to fulfill our mission and achieve our vision. These goals are: engage members, extend mission, expand membership, and achieve financial stability. A great deal of energy and enthusiasm were expended to achieve all of this, but comparable energy and enthusiasm was not available to sustain the momentum and implement objectives.

During the last year the Planning Committee has reexamined the long range plan, concluded that it is a good plan with appropriate goals and challenged us to engage the boards in collaborative efforts to implement actions that will enable us to fulfill our mission and achieve our vision. In April as the staff was discussing things they could do to help focus the congregation's attention on the long range plan, the idea of having a theme for the church program year surfaced and staff members began enthusiastically brainstorming around the idea and were excited when they came up with "Embrace the Vision, Live the Mission" as a suggested theme. This was shared with the Planning Committee and then with the Executive Board receiving enthusiastic support from both.

You're going to be hearing, "Embrace the Vision, Live the Mission," a lot throughout this church year as we attempt to flesh out this theme. We will make this theme a vital part of our lives through worship. Each of the boards will be identifying a variety of activities and events that will help communicate this theme. We'll be receiving a letter from the Stewardship Board within the week urging us to embrace the vision and live the mission by making generous pledges to support the ministry of GCC in 2011. Periodically you will read articles and notices in the Broadcaster from various boards and church leaders encouraging your participation in events and activities that will help us embrace the vision and live the mission.

I hope by now that "embrace the vision, live the mission" has gotten into your head like one of those tunes you hear that you can't seem to get out of your head. May "embrace the vision, live the mission" not only get in your head but get in your heart too so that with joy and compassion we do everything possible to learn, love, and serve in God's name in such a way that we become a strong community of Christian faith welcoming and engaging all people in personal and spiritual growth. Embrace the vision, live the mission.
