BECAUSE I HAVE BEEN GIVEN MUCH

For fifty years, George and Leona were faithful and loyal members of their church. George was a retired civil engineer, and Leona divided her time between making a home and volunteering with the church's Women's Guild. I had a conversation with George and Leona about this time of year thirty years ago. George wanted to talk about their financial support of the church. Our conversation went like this:

- George: **How many members does our church have?**
- Me: **225.**
- George: **What will the bottom line be for next year's church budget?**
- Me: **I don't know. The budget isn't finished yet.**
- George: **Why not?**
- Me: **One reason is that we need to know what our pledges will be.**
- George: **Well, that doesn't help me. I need to know what the bottom line is before we can make our pledge.**
- Me: **Why is that?**
- George: **Because I take the bottom line of the church's budget, divide it by the number of our church's members, then multiply by two. That's our fair share. That's our pledge.**

George had a perfectly logical system for determining the financial support that he and Leona would give to the Message, Ministries and Mission of their church.

Here's how George's system would work if we used it for our church...for Glenview Community Church. We have approximately 1,300 members and our budget this year is approximately \$1,300,000. That makes the math very easy! We need every mem-

ber of GCC to commit \$1,000 to the support of our church.

But George's system has some problems. Though it establishes a fair-share pledge for each member in dollars, it does not consider our financial resources; our ability to give. \$1,000 for a person whose income is \$100,000/year is half as much real money as \$1,000 is for a person whose income is \$50,000/year. Then there are our dependents and financial obligations to consider.

The greatest failing of George's method is that it has no faith dimension. One of the bedrock blessings of the Christian life is the blessing of giving. God calls us to be stewards...to use what God has trusted to us to do God's work by sharing God's love and caring for the needs of others. God gives us an abundance to use. It is not ours. We do not own it. But God trusts us with it. And God rejoices when we receive that abundance with gratitude and humbly do the healing work of life and love in God's world. This perspective on stewardship is not about the church's financial need. It's about our spiritual need to give...a need that will make us dry up inside if we do not fulfill it.

Many of you know that my favorite stewardship hymn is **Because I Have Been Given Much**. The words of that hymn were written eighty years ago by poet **Grace Noll Crowell** as she was recovering from an illness that nearly ended her life. In that recovery she was overwhelmed by a profound sense of gratitude for the abundance that God had given her. So she wrote:

Because I have been given much, I, too, must give.

Three of our greatest poverties are these:

1. believing that we have earned and deserve everything we have...
2. believing that our abundance of blessings is less than what we need...
3. and believing that striving to fulfill our insatiable appetite for more will make us happy

Here are the antidotes for these poverties:

1. believing that everything we have is a gift and trust from God...
2. believing that our abundance of blessings allows us the pleasure of meeting the needs of others...
3. and believing that happiness is giving what we have been given.

Or, in the words of our stewardship campaign, **Trust in the Promise!** How we trust in God's promise to us determines the meaning, the purpose and the hope of our lives.

Yes, GCC has financial needs. But what GCC needs most is for each of us to experience and express the blessing of stewardship: a vital, invested and growing faith that makes God's love real in the world because God's love has become real in our hearts.

It was a near-death experience that made Grace Noll Crowell realize how much she had been given. May we also come to that blessed realization. And may we discover and live the greatness of life: life that thrives not because of what we get, but because of what we give! See you in church.
