THANKSGIVING

How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts! My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the Lord; my heart and my flesh sing for joy to the living God.

So begins the 84th Psalm, a song of praise to God. In a very particular sense, this psalm sings praise for the temple in Jerusalem whose overwhelming majesty and breath-taking beauty inspire awe and wonder in those who enter its courts. But, in a broader sense, this psalm invites us to sing praise to the One who is our Dwelling Place...the One who is our Provider and Protector... the One in whom we live, and move, and have our being...the One whose greatness and graciousness can never be more than poorly reflected even in the grandest glory of human architecture and art. Ultimately our dwelling place is God: God to whom all of the natural and fabricated wonders of this created world witness. As we sang at the beginning of our worship on November 10th:

O Lord my God! When I in awesome wonder, consider all the worlds Thy hands have made, I see the stars, I hear the rolling thunder, Thy power throughout the universe displayed. Then sings my soul, my Savior God to Thee, how great Thou art, how great Thou art! Then sings my soul, my Savior God to Thee, how great Thou art, how great Thou art!

In the elegance of its simplicity, the sanctuary of the Glenview Community Church reflects the greatness and the graciousness of our God. There is no stone or stained glass. There is no sculpture or intricately carved wood. Instead, the light of creation paints God's glory in pastel shades on the walls, pews and floor. And the hanging cross that is echoed in the cruciform communion table below it reminds us with simple profundity of God's unending love. Our sanctuary is a sanctuary that gets out of the way so

that God can be God. Each time I enter our sanctuary I hear ***How Great Thou Art*** in my mind, and I am filled with thanksgiving for the blessings of dwelling with God.

It is such a necessary perspective for me – and I hope for you – to give thanks in worship together. This year, being with you in Glenview and at GCC is among the greatest blessings for which Jeanie and I are giving thanks. You are striving to be the church God calls us to be, and God's Spirit that urges us on is so obvious in this congregation! ***Yes, How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts!***

As you prepare for Thanksgiving by making your lists of blessings for which you give thanks, I pray that the Glenview Community Church will have a prominent place. In thanksgiving we are making our financial commitments for GCC's ministry in 2014. As of this writing we have received 303 pledges, totaling \$666,000 toward our goal of \$1,100,000. If you have not yet made your financial commitment, please prayerfully consider doing so. And let your commitment be a fitting expression of your thanksgiving.

Later in the 84th Psalm we hear these words:

I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than live in the tents of wickedness.

A doorkeeper in the house of God: there are so many ways for us to do that...to serve God who is our dwelling place in this world. Besides our financial commitments to GCC's ministry in 2014, let me lift up two of many particular ways.

First, we can respond generously to the desperate human suffering in the typhoon-

HUNGER IS NO GAME!

The special offering, to be collected on November 24, will support the work of A Just Harvest (AJH), in honor and memory of the many GCC volunteers who have gathered, cooked, delivered and served food at AJH for 29 of its 30 years. To ensure that your donation goes to this GCC mission partner, please use the special Thanksgiving envelope or send the church a check, payable to Glenview Community Church, with "A Just Harvest" on the memo line. In October, A Just Harvest honored GCC with its annual Winston Garnett and Mary Byrd award for service. Be sure to see the lovely stained glass memento of the award.



AJH's mission is to fight poverty and hunger in the Rogers Park and greater Chicago community by providing nutritious meals daily while cultivating community and economic development and organizing across racial, cultural and socioeconomic lines in order to create a more just society.

Serving nutritious meals 365 days a year, AJH is feeding more people now than at any time since its founding in 1983. In addition to its dinners for all in need, AJH feeds 40-60 kids per day, some in the Community Kitchen and others by supplying tens of thousands of pounds of food to a local after-school program. Almost 1 in 5 young people live in homes where the parents don't earn enough money to put nutritious food on the table every day. And Congress just cut the small amount of help parents receive through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP or food stamps). Kids who don't get enough healthy food to eat have trouble in school, and the consequences can last a life time.

AJH's Genesis project marshalls community assets and outside resources to create jobs and social enterprises, such as the Aquaponics Project in partnership with Gale Math and Science Academy.

NORTHSIDE P.O.W.E.R.

(People Organized to Work, Educate and Restore) trains leaders and organizes communities to win public policies that alleviate poverty and hunger, and create a more just economy. AJH believes that ordinary people must have the power to hold our elected officials and other powerful decision makers accountable to act in the broad public interest in order to eradicate hunger and poverty. The group also provides opportunities for people in relatively powerful positions to partner as an effective voice for social change.



AJH Executive Director, Reverend Marilyn Pagan-Banks, will deliver the Mission Moment on November 24 and answer

questions at the Christmas Giving Market in the Mayflower Room after worship.

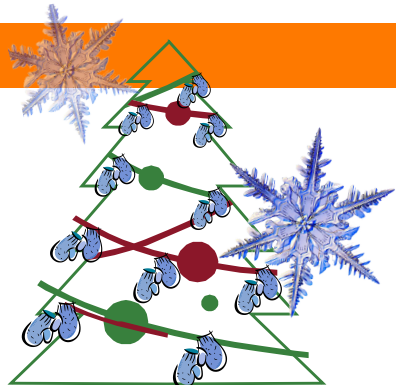
POINSETTIA AND ALTAR FLOWERS
