A few weeks ago, I sat on the altar steps to talk to the younger kids about the Pageant during a **For Children Mostly** session. I started off talking about traditions in general and asked them to think about traditions that are special to them, like eating a special meal on their birthday or going on summer vacation with all their cousins, and then I segued into how the Pageant has been a very special tradition in the church for over 65 years, and that I hoped they would make it a tradition in their lives. But what's the big deal about the "tradition" aspect of the Pageant?

Heidi Stevens, who writes a weekly column in the Sunday Chicago Tribune, recently penned an article called The Beauty of Tradition – Even in a Mall which summed up the importance of traditions for both children and parents. For kids, traditions bring predictability, "a sense of belonging and safety. They know what to expect and can lean on it when life feels unpredictable." We all know the Pageant pretty much stays the same year after year - after all, there aren't a lot of changes to the story of Jesus' birth! The kids know that they will get to play a different part each year from the time they are in kindergarten to being seniors in high school. If they stick with it, they get excited about which costumes they get to wear for Children of All Nations, they know the cymbal crash of the soldiers is coming but it still makes them jump, and they think about what roles they want to play when they "grow up" (to be 17 or 18). When I was rehearsing roles with some high school kids last week, and was reading through the narration of the Pageant, they could practically recite it word for word along with me. I also know several high school

boys who can do many of the tableau angel moves, having watched the performances for so many years! And lest you think these are the ramblings of a 51-year-old who is waxing nostalgic about her own experience in the Pageant 30+ years ago, let me share the words of two girls who are high school seniors this year:

- "I have been in the Pageant from being one of many little kids in pillow cases crowded around Jesus' cradle to now one of the two Gabriels. I have participated every year between, because I love the atmosphere - being around kids for so many weeks at a time brings us all closer together as a group, and as we got older and into PYF (our youth group), it became even more important in forming relationships. Also, putting on a production for the community to show them what we have been working so hard on is awesome, too!" (Kala Jablonski)
- "I love Pageant because it has provided me with an excellent group of friends and a community that transcends generational boundaries. Also, it is a great way to give back to the church, as well as a chance to perform on stage, growing into roles that I looked up to as a younger performer. The competitive nature of senior roles speaks to the enthusiasm that all performers feel for this annual tradition." (Kathryn Heyser)

suddenly your loved ones' changes jump into stark relief." I immediately thought of the Pageant scrapbook I made for my high school senior daughter for Christmas last year, where I had a picture or two of every year she was in the Pageant, starting with being in our Zum Gali family when she was in pre-school to her role as Gabriel as a senior. Anyone who flips through it will see the changes as well as the similarities in her as the years progressed. "You think you'll slow down enough to observe and savor all the ways your kids are evolving into new people each day. But sometimes it's tough. Sometimes you're too busy buying laundry detergent and registering for camp and scheduling dentist appointments to take notice of all the big and little changes. Traditions, by their very nature, press pause on all of that."

When I agreed to take over being the Pageant director three years ago, my main reason was because I wanted to have today's children experience the same magic and wonder of the Pageant that I, and thousands of children for the last 60+ years, have experienced. In a world where things seem to be changing at an every-increasing pace, the Pageant offers all of us, but especially our children, the opportunity to be a part of a timeless and memorable tradition. Not only is it our annual gift to the community, but a joyous celebration of "the reason for the season" which sets the mood for Christmas in a very meaningful way. Let this be the year your family starts or continues a cherished Pageant tradition. C.J. Sultz


