The Nativity

This year we are looking back at the history of Glenview Community Church. It is hard not to find that a significant part of the history is the annual presentation of The Nativity. This is the 60th anniversary of the beginning of this tradition.

Like I mentioned in the Pageant moment in church, it is not like others with bathrobes and bed sheets, but a unique tradition with beautiful scenes, exquisite costumes, graceful dancing, and glorious music. A timeless story as a young boy of today dreams of what actually happened so long ago. There is something mystical and magical about The Nativity of Glenview Community Church.

I often struggle with how to explain our pageant to others, and what it means to those who are dedicated to re-enacting the story. I went through some archives that we have of the Pageant. We found a letter that was rewritten in the Broadcaster in 1968 which expresses the feeling that many have experienced. It is from a girl who was a college freshman at the time. She writes:

"At the moment I am experiencing a 'crisis' of growing up. For the first time in years, I am not going to see the Christmas Pageant. I can remember being a Child of Light and holding my candle high for the Christ child. And seeing Mary and Joseph and the baby - it was real then wasn't it? The Children of All Nations - I was able in my own way to help bind the world together. To suffer and pay taxes as a 'Zum Gali'... to light the way as a Walking Angel.. to guide the people and instruct them in the ways of Christ's coming as a Tableau Angel...to welcome the Mother into the stable as the InnKeeper's Wife.. all these have been mine in the past Christmas seasons. And now... not only am I not a part of the pageant - I don't even get to see it. My Christmas actually begins with

the beautiful story that unfolds in the sanctuary. I will dearly miss it this year."

I do not think it could be stated any better. Whether it is 1968 or 2010 or any of the years in between, over three generations have told many similar versions of their own experience. They enjoy each role they play and truly miss it when they leave.

To capture this tradition, this year the choir, instrumentalists of the church, and friends spent an incredible week in October rehearsing and recording the music and narration of the Pageant. Now you will be able to listen to the entire pageant wherever you are and imagine you are here in the sanctuary. You can close your eyes and envision yourself or your children or grandchildren performing their roles on the stage. This keepsake will be available at the pageant. It will be a treasure to own.

Please join us on December 4 at 10:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. for this year's pageant. You will be able to see some of the history on display, and share in the magic as we tell the story. We hope that your children will be enriched by the experience and will remember it for the rest of their lives, and that you will all leave with the spirit of Christmas inside you.

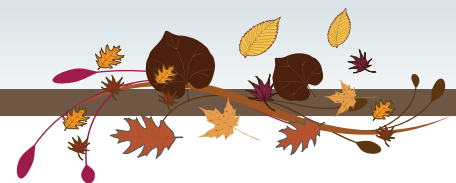

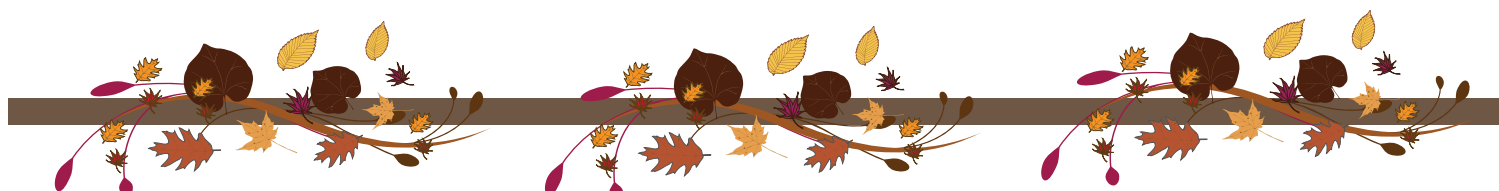
Christmas Tree Pick-Up

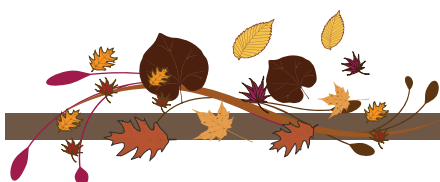
